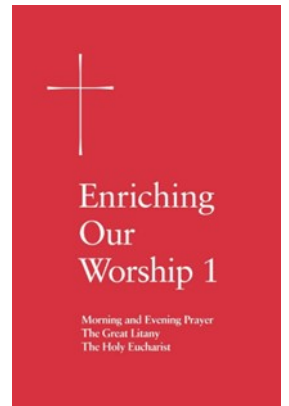

*The Peace of the Lord be with you...*

The *Enriching Our Worship* (EOW) series of alternate rites and services has been around a while – the first coming out in 1997. The Standing Liturgical Committee authorized these rites that include an alternative *Great Litany, Morning and Evening Prayer* and have added significantly to the list of services by adding the *Burial of a Child*. They have also added three alternate *Holy Eucharists* – one of which we will sample throughout the rest of the summer.



These eucharists aim at broader range of theological images in *the Eucharistic Prayers*, and bring more gender inclusive language into the rite. As the Episcopal Church is now in the process of creating a revised *Book of Common Prayer*, I daresay they will take a hard look at – if not include – some of the alternate services.

For our eucharists July through October we will use the first and most straight-forward of the Eucharistic Prayers that EOW has to offer. You will notice various changes like, “God be with you” rather than “The Lord be with You” and “Blessed be the one, holy and living God” as opposed to “Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit”.

I hope you find the EOW rite this summer meaningful and prayerful. We begin this Sunday!
